Sound Collage	A combination of sounds, which may include vocal and instrumental sounds, to create a specific atmosphere or to accompany important moments of a scene. Hot-seating	A technique used to gain a deeper understanding of a character or role. The person in the 'hot seat' answers questions in role as the character.
