Key Vocabulary and Definitions To Be Learnt		What Will The Assessment Look Like?
<b>Cricket Bat</b>	Equipment used to play cricket with.	BASE Assessment <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Beginning</li> <li>• Approaching</li> <li>• Secure</li> <li>• Exceeding</li> </ul>
<b>Cricket Ball</b>	Equipment used to play cricket with.	
<b>Stumps</b>	Three vertical posts that support the bails and form the wicket found at the ends of a cricket pitch.	
<b>Wicket</b>	When a fielder dismisses a batsman.	
<b>Boundary</b>	The boundary is the perimeter of a playing field. It is also the term given to a scoring shot where the ball is hit to, or beyond, that perimeter, which generally earns four or six runs for the batting team.	
<b>Grip</b>	Two V's created down the cricket bat handle.	
<b>Over arm Bowling</b>	A delivery in which the bowler's hand is above shoulder height.	
<b>Forward Drive (Straight Drive)</b>	Where the batsman advances his front leg to the pitch (direction) of the ball and plays it in front of the wicket, along the floor with power.	
<b>Long Barrier</b>	The long barrier is the safest technique to control a cricket ball that is travelling along the ground. <b>Backing Up</b>	Where you support your fielders with giving protection if they miss or throw the ball past the target.	
<b>High Catch</b>	A high catch refers to a ball that is coming in from a high position, usually over the fielder's head or towards the fielder's head.	
<b>Low Catch</b>	You have a stable base, ready to move, level eyes and an open hand position with fingers pointing down.	
<b>Batsmen</b>	The person in bat.	
<b>Fielder</b>	The players who are out on the pitch.	
<b>Umpire</b>	The person who officiates the game of cricket.	

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<b>LBW</b>	Leg before wicket- When the ball hits a batsmen's leg without any bat and the ball is in line with the stumps.	
<b>Wide Ball</b>	Where the ball is bowled wide of where the striker is standing, and which also would have passed wide of the striker standing in a normal guard position.	
<b>No Ball</b>	Where the ball is bowled above the waist height or the bowler's foot is over the crease line.	
<b>Crease</b>	They define the area within which the batsmen and bowlers operate
