Props	A prop, formally known as property is an object used on stage by the actors during a performance.		
Personal props	Items of a personal nature that enhance a character e.g. Annie's locket in the production of 'Annie'.	 Section 3 – Extended piece of work. Opportunity for extended writing. Focusing on the role of the designer (20 marks)

Costume	What is worn by the actors to convey the characters age, status and personality.
