• What does mixed media mean in Art? Students will develop an understanding of what, "mixed media" means in Art (Mixed media refers to the use of multiple art forms or materials in a single artwork). They will explore the process of creating a piece of artwork that introduces the concept of mixed media and revisits the visual elements. This fosters creativity and encourages innovative approaches to art-making. Working with mixed media improves problem-solving skills. Students must consider how different materials interact, how to achieve desired effects, and how to include various components in their artwork. How do a range of artist use mark making in the work they create, as well as developing an understanding on how different application and

approaches to mark making can alter the look and feeling of a piece of art.

Analyse and describe a range of different artist works from different times and cultures, focusing on how they use the mark making & mixed media in an individual way to create a desired effect. Students will illustrate an understanding of the mixed media by creating a range of art works in the lesson.

• How will students explore mix media?

Students will explore, and be able explain a range of mixed media techniques and will be introduced to a range of artist including as Paul Kenton, Vincent Scarpace and Banksy.

Students will work using a range of different materials and medias to create a range of images based on insects which will be used to explore a variety of mixed media techniques and methods.
