<b>Immigrant</b>	A person who has come to a different country to live there permanently.	
<b>Danelaw</b>	Areas of England that were under control of the Vikings.	
<b>Colonise</b>	To send settlers to a place and have them establish control over that place.	
<b>Craft Guild</b>	An association of craftsmen who set the standards of quality and price of goods.	
<b>Huguenots</b>	French protestants in the 16 <sup>th</sup> and 17 <sup>th</sup> centuries who followed the teachings of John Calvin.	
<b>Refugee</b>	A person who has been forced to leave their country to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster.	Family Learning Opportunities
<b>Entrepreneurs</b>	Someone who starts/backers businesses for financial gain.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Colour a world map with countries in which people have migrated to Britain from.</li> <li>• Interview a family member who may have moved to Britain from another country. What was their experience like?</li> <li>• Research a group of people who have migrated to the UK (causes, experiences, impact)?</li> </ul>
<b>Great Famine</b>	A severe shortage of food caused by the failure of potato crops in Ireland.	
<b>Kindertransport</b>	A mission which took thousands of Jewish children to safety in Britain ahead of World War Two (1939-1945).	
<b>Commonwealth</b>	Former/current countries belonging under the British Empire.	
<b>National Front</b>	A racist anti-immigration political party that rose in popularity during the 1970s and 1980s.	
<b>Deported</b>	Removing a foreigner from a country typically for being there illegally or being a criminal.
