Key Term	Definition	Extended writing – “Deliberate Practice” - activities during lessons. End of topic assessment: 30 minutes • Short answer questions – 10/10 (10 simple sentences). • Extended writing – 15/15 (4 X PEE {A}: arguments for/against and 1 x PEE: conclusion)
Worship	Believers expressing love and respect, and devotion to God.	
Reverence	To show respect and honour to God.	
Adoration	To show deep love and respect to God.	
Deity	God or goddess. (god or goddess with a small ‘g’ refers to beings with supernatural powers that have nothing to do with god as the creator .)	Family Learning Opportunities As a family, discuss the following question. “Should religious buildings be sold to help the poor and feed the starving”? What do you think? What can be considered as positive reasons? What could be considered as negative reasons?
Abrahamic Religions	The Abrahamic religions are a group of religions centred around worship of the God of Abraham - Judaism, Christianity and Islam.	
Synagogue	A Jewish place of worship.	
Church	A Christian place of worship.	
Mosque	A Muslim place of worship.	
Gurdwara	A Sikh place of worship.	
Waheguru	Waheguru is a word used in Sikhism to refer to God as described in Guru Granth Sahib.	
Guru Granth Sahib Ji	The holy book in Sikhism.	
Liturgical Worship	A set form of worship, usually following agreed words.	
Non-Liturgical Worship	A form of worship which is not set.	
Pilgrimage	A journey to a religious or holy place.
