- You develop your writing ability, learning to present your thoughts clearly and write coherent arguments, which are grounded in reason.
- You reflect on and develop your own views about a range of religious, spiritual, ethical and philosophical issues.

Future Pathways

Due to the wide range of skills that students will develop over the two years in GCSE Religious Studies, a variety of potential career paths will be available, such as law, politics, medicine, education and volunteer work.

Two 1 hours 45 minute written external examinations are taken at the end of the course. There are no tiers of entry.
