Colonies	The areas of land controlled by an Empire. New World The term for countries explored during the Tudor period.	
Privateer	A pirate with a licence from the monarch to attack enemy ships.	
East India Company	A British trading company that traded in India.	
Sepoy	An Indian soldier fighting for the British.	
Mutiny	A rebellion limited to the army.	Family Learning Opportunities
Penal Colony	A settlement used to exile prisoners and separate them in a far away, isolated location.	
Manacles	Restraints such as handcuffs.
