<b>Natural Evil</b>	Suffering that is naturally caused.	
<b>Omnipotent</b>	All-powerful	
<b>Omnibenevolent</b>	All-loving	
<b>Omniscient</b>	All-knowing	
<b>Free Will</b>	God's gift to humanity allowing them to make their own choices.	Family Learning Opportunities
<b>Jihad</b>	To strive or struggle in the name of Allah	When watching news topics consider forgiveness and whether you as a family would forgive the actions of those you have seen in the media
<b>Suffering</b>	The bearing or undergoing of pain or distress.	
<b>Dukkha</b>	Suffering, pain or stress.	
<b>The Buddha</b>	refers to the Siddhartha Gautama.	
<b>Enlightenment</b>	The discovery of true knowledge, usually by meditation, about oneself and reality and so escaping the cycle of rebirth.	
<b>Dhamma</b>	The teaching of the Buddha.	
<b>Meditation</b>	The practice of calming and focusing the mind.	
<b>Atheist</b>	A person who disbelieves or lacks belief in the existence of God or gods.	
<b>Theist</b>	A person who believes in the existence of a god or gods.	

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<b>Humanist</b>	A non religious person with a strong concern for human welfare, values, and dignity.	
<b>Reconciliation</b>	The action of making one view or belief compatible with another.	
<b>Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) -</b>	The final prophet in Islam, known as the 'Seal of the Prophets'.
