Reformation	A religious movement that wanted to break away from the Catholic church and set up their own Protestant church.	
The Pope	The Head of the Catholic Church.	
'Great Matter'	The problems between Henry VIII and the Pope.	
Armada	A large group of warships.	
Abbey	A church building where monks live.	
Abbot	A leader of a religious community of monks.	
Monastery	A Catholic place of worship. – Usually where Monks or Nuns live.	
Exploration	Exploring an unfamiliar place.	
Foreign Policy	A country's strategy in dealing with other countries abroad.	<p>Family Learning Opportunities</p>
Break from Rome	The Reformation in England where Henry VIII passed laws to take control and created the Church of England (Protestant).
