Mobilise	To prepare soldiers for war.

Stalemate	A situation where neither side can win (a draw).	
Artillery	Large guns used in warfare on land.	
Home front	The civilian population at home during a time when the army is fighting abroad.	
Conscription	The compulsory enrolment of people into the military for war.	
Suffragette	A women seeking the right to vote through protest.
