Segregation	The action or state of separating a group of people from the rest of society.	Section 1: Previous Knowledge 20% - 6 1-mark questions. Civil Rights	The rights of people to political and social freedom and equality.	
Ku Klux Klan	A white supremacist group in the USA.	
Lynching	To kill someone for an alleged offence without a legal trial, usually hanging.	
NAACP	The National Association for the Advancement of Coloured People – created in 1909 to work for African American's equal rights.	
National Guard	Reserve soldiers in America who can be called upon by state governments.	
Boycott	To refuse to use something in protest.	
Integration	Bringing different groups of people together.	
Unconstitutional	Something that is not in line with the rules.
