| <b>Calligraphy</b>                          | Is a visual art related to writing and is the design and execution of lettering with a pen, ink brush, or other writing instrument.<br>Contemporary calligraphic practice can be defined as "the art of giving form to signs in an expressive, harmonious, and skilful manner". | <p><b>Extended writing</b> – “Deliberate Practice” activities during lessons.</p> <p><b>End of topic assessment:</b> 30 minutes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Short answer questions – 10/10 (10 simple sentences).</li> <li>• <b>Extended writing</b> – 15/15 (4 X PEE {A}: arguments for/against and 1 x PEE: conclusion)</li> </ul>  |
| <b>Kiswah</b>                               | The cloth that covers the Kaaba in Mecca, Saudi Arabia. It is draped annually on the 9th day of the month of Dhu al-Hijjah, the day pilgrims leave for the plains of Mount Arafat during the Hajj.  |  |
| <b>Ka’ba</b>                                | The holiest site in Islam, it is also known as the ‘house of peace’ and the mosque which every Muslim faces when they pray.   |  |
| <b>Lourdes</b>                              | A pilgrimage site in France for Christians  |  |
| <b>Crucifixion</b>                          | A method to kill someone by nailing them to a cross.  |  |
| <b>Holy Trinity</b>                         | The Christian belief that there is one God and he is known as God the father, God the son and God the Holy Spirit – all are one God.  | <p><b>Family Learning Opportunities</b></p> <p>Design a pray flag that represents your household.</p> <p><b>Make Your Household Pray Flags</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut the fabric for the flag to 5” x 11”.</li> <li>• When you are designing a flag, it is very important that you choose colours and images that symbolise, for example, your “household”, places that you have visited as a family or your religion.</li> <li>• Add words or images to your flag using free motion stitching, hand stitching, or simply by writing in a permanent marker.</li> <li>• Hang your flags inside your living room by threading a string through each flag.</li> </ul> |
| <b>Sacrifice</b>                            | An offering to God.   |  |
| <b>Ganesh Chathuri</b>                      | A ten-day Hindu festival that celebrates the birthday of Ganesh.  |  |
| <b>Asceticism</b>                           | The life of a holy man, when you deny yourself excess and indulgence.   |  |
| <b>Enlightenment</b>                        | An understanding about what is true and real.   |  |
| <b>Renunciation</b>                         | Giving something up, in this case the Buddha renounced his princely life.   |  |
| <b>Buddha</b>                               | A title meaning the enlightened one, given to the man, Siddhartha Gautama.  |  |
| <b>meditation</b>                           | Thinking about and reflecting on something deeply.  |  |
| <b>Prayer flag</b>                          | A piece of fabric with prayers written on them, hung up for the words to be taken by the wind.  |  |
